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## THE PARIS PROPERTY CHRONICLES

### [Paris Rental Market](#)

In Episode 3 of the Paris Property Chronicles, now available on [Apple Podcasts](#) and [Podbean](#) for Android devices, my guest is Marie Pistinier, founder and principal of [Paris Be a Part of It](#) and [LOKIM](#), which has a portfolio of 500 furnished rental apartments on a medium and long-term basis. The economics of short-term rentals has become less and less attractive due to the ban of nearly all vacation rentals in Paris, the expected downturn in tourism due to COVID-19 travel restrictions and [Airbnb](#) laying off nearly 25% of their workforce. Conversely, long term rentals, especially on a furnished basis, will remain a safe and sound investment.



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### [Paris Eases Restrictions](#)

The first phase in the ease of restrictions in France began on May 11th. The government created a national strategy permitting each department and municipality to implement the plan locally. Each department is designated as a RED or GREEN zone ([see Deconfinement Map](#)) based on **three indicators**:

- rate of new cases per week,
- the capacity of ICU beds in hospitals, and
- availability of local testing.

France has committed to have an inventory of more than **20 million masks** and the ability to perform **700,000 tests** per week. The government has also pledged **€500 million** towards global research to eradicate the virus. As of May 11th, you can travel within a 100km radius from your primary residence without documentation. Click [here](#) to calculate the 100km radius from your residence. 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In Paris, 75% of public transit will be restored and riders will be required to wear a mask, gel and hand sanitiser will be made available at most bus stops and Métro stations, and 2,2 million masks will be available in pharmacies. Mayor Hildago plans to restrict traffic on major arteries throughout the city in an effort to maintain the near-perfect air quality achieved during the lockdown.
